Jean Christophe, Global Head of Public Investment Origination at pbb Deutsche Pfandbriefbank, said: "Green energies in general and solar energy in particular will have a rising share in France's energy mix. We consider research in this area to be of extraordinary importance. For pbb, the financing of green infrastructure is part of our Public Investment Finance strategy and we are therefore particularly happy to be able to support the Conseil Général de la Savoie in this project".
